



IMPORTANT CHANGE COMING TO PITKIN COUNTY SENIOR SERVICES

With guidance from Pitkin County Public Health, starting Monday November 22nd, admittance into the Senior Center will now require proof of COVID-19 vaccination until further notice.

Pursuant to the Pitkin County Public Health Order, proof of vaccination means one of the below forms of documentation demonstrating receipt of one course of a single dose COVID-19 vaccine or two doses of any two-dose COVID-19 vaccine.

Proof of vaccination can be verified with one of the following methods:

- COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card (issued by the Department of Health and Human Services Centers for Disease Control & Prevention or WHO Yellow Card) which includes name of person vaccinated, type of vaccine provided, and date last dose administered); OR
- A photo of a Vaccination Record Card as a separate document; OR
- A photo of the individual's Vaccination Record Card stored on a phone or electronic device; OR
- Documentation of COVID-19 vaccination from a health care provider; OR
- Digital record accessed through the myColorado application.

Please be prepared to show Senior Services staff one of the above forms of proof of vaccination before entering the Senior Center. Proof will only need to be shown the first time you visit after this mandate takes effect. Masks are still required to be worn inside the center at all times, unless eating or drinking.

No exceptions to proof of vaccination will be accepted.
